Who do we serve?

Matthew 25 Health and Dental Clinic serves residents of Northeast Indiana and Northwest Ohio who are uninsured and whose household incomes are at or below 150% of the Federal Poverty Guideline.

Is there a fee?

Matthew 25 has asked patients for a \$5.00 copay for a medical appointment; a \$10.00 copay for a dental appointment (\$5.00 copay for dental walk in). This is not a mandatory fee. This is a voluntary donation from the patient.

How is the clinic funded?

Matthew 25 is totally privately funded. Revenues come from:

Matthew 25 Health and Dental Clinic

Our history

The Matthew 25 Health and Dental Clinic opened May 1, 1976 as an outgrowth of a prayer group that was concerned about the violence in the inner city in the form of hunger and sickness. The original purpose of the clinic was to provide health screening and health education to the poor. Staffed by lay and professional volunteers, the clinic soon became an acute care facility. Currently over 400 people volunteer at Matthew 25. This includes physicians, dentists, nurse practitioners, nurses, dental assistants, dental hygienists, medication room workers, clerical and many other support volunteers. Referrals to alternate health care providers are made for patients who need either specialized care or require ongoing care for a chronic health condition. There is an excellent consultation and tertiary care support from the medical and dental community. We provide general medical and dental care, as well as specialty clinics in diabetes, blood pressure, ophthalmology, physical therapy, ear-nose-throat, urology, women's clinics for pap smears, podiatry, dermatology, pain management, cardiology and pulmonary. Lab tests that can be done here include urinalysis, blood sugar, hemoglobin, strep throat, and pregnancy. Dental services include exams, x-rays, dental home care instructions, cleanings, fillings, extractions, full and partial dentures.

Dental clinic

The Dental Clinic opened in 1979, providing complete dental care for low-income individuals through the cooperation of volunteer dentists, assistants and hygienists.

Emergencies are treated on a first come, first served basis; these services are provided both at the clinic or referred to a volunteer dentist's office.

Health education

Health education is another important service offered at Matthew 25. Primarily this service occurs through dietetic counseling, wellness education, lifestyle awareness and patient advocacy. Our goal is to give each patient the knowledge to make the right health and lifestyle choices. Through preventative health programs, Matthew 25 is able to provide people with the tools that assist them in improving their health and their quality of life.

Fund-raisers

Matthew 25 sponsors two major fundraiser each year, "The Dr. Phillip O'Shaughnessy Walk/Run for Health" and "Heart and Soul". We also have many other little fundraisers and ongoing ways to give back throughout the year. Such as Kroger Community Rewards program which allows you to connect your Kroger Plus Card to our clinic and Kroger will donate to us each time you shop. Volunteers

The very heart of what we do at Matthew 25 is the hundreds of volunteers who give tirelessly to the clinic. The dedication and commitment shared with the feast of our brethren is exhibited over and over again.

It takes many hands to serve the many people we see each year, from the registration clerks at the front desk, to the volunteers who fill out mountains of paperwork so we can get free medications from the pharmaceutical companies, to the health care professionals who assess and treat patients.

This is truly a community clinic where we see neighbor taking care of neighbor. This community can be very proud of how we take care of one another. But we always need more volunteers. As the number of people needing our care increases, the need for volunteers does too.
